CHINA: LEGAL CHURCH WILL BE FULLY SINICISED

plus: another Christian human rights lawyer goes missing

On 1 September Measures on the Administration of Religious Activity Venues will come into force. The Measures stipulate that Religious Activity Venues must pro-actively support the leadership of the CCP, including the establishment of 'a study system' through which church leaders will be indoctrinated, and by ensuring sermon content advances CCP agendas. The Measures will ensure the legal, CCP-registered 'Church' is fully sinicised as a branch of the CCP propaganda system. At this point it will probably be impossible for faithful, Gospel-focused Christians to remain in the system. Meanwhile, on 11 May, a Chinese court sentenced Christian human rights writer and lawyer Yang Maodong (57) – pen-name Guo Feixiong – to eight years in prison. He joins his dear friend Christian human rights lawyer Gao Zhisheng (59) as one whose whereabouts are unknown. *Please pray*.

PRAYER REQUESTS

- Please pray that Christians facing the burden of surveillance and tight regulation will be given strength, wisdom, and boldness as they navigate challenges.
- Please pray for the families of the believers in China who have gone missing after being arrested and haven't been heard from since.

Deuteronomy 1-3

- I. Intro to Deuteronomy
 - A. Outline of Deuteronomy
 - 1. Recap of Israel's journey from Egypt (Dt 1–3)
 - 2. How to love God and keep His commandments (Dt 4–26)
 - 3. Blessings, curses, and restoration (Dt 27–30)
 - 4. The death of Moses and Joshua's succession (Dt 31–34)
 - B. Why does Deut. relay Israel's history in an abbreviated fashion in the opening chapters?
- II. The History of Israel
 - A. Deut. begins and ends in the same place: A call to love God
 - B. God saved their parents (Dt 1:8)
 - C. Establishing leadership (Dt 1:17–18)
 - D. He recalls one of the great sins of disbelief among their parents' generation. (Dt 1:39)
 - E. This leads Moses to remind the people that God blessed them (Dt 2:7)

- F. Moses blamed Israel for his failure to enter into the Promised Land. (Dt 1:37, 3:26, Num 20:9-12)
- G. The historical narrative closes with the command to commission Joshua as the next leader who will bring the people into the Promised Land.

 - A. In many ways our history is similar to theirs
 - 1. Broadly speaking we are all children of disobedient parents in Adam (Gen 3)
 - 2. Generational chaos
 - 3. First generation believers and second generation believers

 - C. We all need godly authorities over us who can lead us to the Savior! (Dt 1:15-18)
