Pastor Released from Notorious Prison

Ethnic Armenian Iranian Pastor Joseph Shahbazian was arrested on 30 June 2020 when agents from the Islamic Revolutionary Guard Corps raided his house church gathering in Tehran. He was sentenced in June 2022 to 10 years in prison to be followed by two years internal exile for 'founding or leading an organisation that aims to disrupt national security'. However, in February 2023 the Supreme Court granted him a retrial and in May his sentence was reduced to two years. Then, on the evening of 13 September, Pastor Joseph Shahbazian (59) was summoned to the Evin Prison office and informed that he had been pardoned and was free to leave prison and return to his family, including his first grandchild, born while he was incarcerated. **Thank-you Lord!**

Sermon Scripture: Deuteronomy 4:41-43, 19:1-10 Cities of Refuge

- I. Cities of Refuge
 - A. Ancient context of justice
 - 1. The ancient world was a world of revenge.
 - 2. A problem: What if you didn't purposefully kill the person? (Dt 19:5)
 - 3. But God intended Israel to be different from the nations around her. (Dt 4:6)
 - 4. Therefore, God needed to establish a different form of legal system among his people.
 - B. Purpose: To establish justice in the land (Num 35:26-28)
 - C. Locations of the cities (Dt 4:43, 19:2-3, 19:8-9, Josh 20:7)

- II. Justice involves punishing the guilty not the innocent A. The manslayer (Job 24:14, Dt 4 & 19)
 - B. Safety in the city for accidents (Num 35:26-28)
 - C. Practical implications
- III. What's the connection between the first two commandments and the Cities of Refuge?
 - A. 2nd Table of the Law flows from 1st Table
 - 1. 10 Commandments have been traditionally referred to as the 2 tablets of the Law (Ex 34:1)
 - 2. Implication: Impossible to build a just society upon secularism or false religion.
 - B. Justice involves protecting the Innocent (Num 35:24-26)
 - 1. Applications
 - 2. Does God only care about those falsely accused/ pursued of a crime they didn't intentionally commit or does his concern from the protection of the innocent transcend this?
- IV. The Gospel connection to communion (Num 35:28, Heb 4:14-:9, 7:1-8:13)
