Arrested, Appealed, Denied

Pastor Acharya has been arrested three different times on different charges. His first arrest happened in March 2020 where he was charged with spreading false rumors that prayer could heal the coronavirus. After posting bail he was rearrested in April 2020 on charges of outraging religious feelings and proselytizing. He again posted bail and was arrested for the third time in May 2020 and was put in prison. In July 2022 the High court in the Jumla region of Nepal, upheld the charges from the district court, but reduced the two year prison sentence to one year and decreased the fine. In 2023 Pastor Acharya tried to appeal the ruling to the Supreme Court, but on January 23, 2024 the Supreme Court denied the appeal and ordered his prison sentence to begin. There are no provisions for reappealing to the Supreme Court. Pastor Acharya's next step is to request his prison sentence to be converted to a fine instead, the success of this attempt will be dependent on the judge assigned to hear the request.

- Please Pray for Pastor Acharya's family as they live through the uncertainty of not knowing what is going to happen to their father/ husband.
- Pray for the believers in Nepal to be encouraged to stand firm as they walk alongside Pastor Acharya in this process.

The God Who Speaks Hebrews 1:1-2

- I. Ingmar Bergman's The Silence
- II. Scripture is the record of God speaking
 - A. From the opening pages of Genesis, the thing that jumps off the page is that God speaks (Gen 1, 3:8, 4:6-7, 6:13, etc)
 - B. It's not a fairy tale but a faithful record (Heb 1:1)
 - C. Hebrews is a hermeneutics textbook on understanding Jesus as the fulfillment of the OT
 - 1. He is a better communicator than the angelic messengers (ch 2)
 - 2. He is a better prophet than Moses (ch 3)
 - 3. He is a better rest than the weekly sabbath (ch 4)
 - 4. He is a better priest-king than Melchizedek (ch 5-7)
 - 5. He is a better sacrifice than the OT sacrifices (ch 9)
 - D. God has spoken to them and he has spoken to us. (Heb 1:1-2)

- III. So how much better is it to be on this side of the AD/BC calendar date line?
 - A. Infinitely better to listen to the Son
 - 1. Long ago Last days
 - 2. The words of one's last days matter
 - B. Don't downplay the Son's importance, he is:
 - 1. Heir of all things (Heb 1:2, Ps 2:8)
 - 2. Creator of the world (Heb 1:2)
 - 3. He is the alpha and omega
